Bynum Beach Canoe Access

Address: Bynum Beach Rd

This canoe access is owned by Chatham County Parks & Recreation. Visitors may access the Haw River but there is no land connection to the State Natural Area. Parking is limited to 2-3 spaces, but more parking is available across the river on the other side of the pedestrian Bynum Bridge.

Robeson Creek Canoe Access

Address: 2505 Hanks Chapel Rd

This canoe access on the Haw River is part of the Jordan Lake State Recreation Area next to the Lower Haw River State Natural Area. State Parks maintains a canoe/kayak launch.

US 15-501 Access

Address: 4551 US 15-501 N

This parking lot off US 15-501 is a NCDOT easement managed by Chatham County Parks & Recreation. Visitors may access the Haw River and the State Natural Area from here.

Bynum Mill Access

Address: Bynum Rd and Bynum Church Rd

State Parks owns two parking lots at the Bynum Mill access to the State Natural Area. One smaller lot is on Bynum Rd next to the pedestrian Bynum Bridge, and the larger lot is downhill off Bynum Church Rd.

US 64 Access

Address: 348 River Access Rd and US 64 East

There are two parking lots on either side of US 64. The larger one on 348 River Access Rd is owned by Chatham County Parks & Recreation. The smaller one on the east side of the river is NCDOT easement.
